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1 35-6-140. Short title. 2 3 This act shall be known and may be cited as the 4 "Reproductive Freedom Act." 5 35-6-141. Public policy. 6 7 8 (a) It is the public policy of the state that: 9 10 (i) Every person has the right to freedom from 11 governmental interference with respect to personal 12 reproductive decisions; 13 14 (ii) Every person has the right to choose or refuse birth control; 15 16 17 (iii) Every person has the right to choose or refuse to have an abortion, except as specifically limited 18

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by this act;

(iv) The state shall not deny or interfere with 21

a person's right to choose or refuse to have an abortion, 22

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except as specifically permitted by this act; 23

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8	(a) As used in this act:
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10	(i) "Abortion" means any medical treatment,
11	medication or procedure intended to induce the termination
12	of a pregnancy except for the purpose of producing a live
13	birth;
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15	(ii) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means
16	as defined by W.S. 33-21-120(a)(i);
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18	(iii) "Health care provider" means a person who
19	is licensed, certified or otherwise authorized or permitted
20	by the laws of this state to administer health care in the
21	ordinary course of business or practice of a profession;

(iv) "Physician" means a person licensed to 2 practice medicine as a physician under the Medical Practice 3 Act; 4 5 (v) "Physician assistant" means person licensed to practice medicine as a physician assistant 6 7 under the Medical Practice Act; 8 9 (vi) "Pregnancy" means the reproductive process 10 beginning with the implantation of an embryo; 11 12 (vii) "Private medical facility" means any medical facility that is not owned or operated by the 13 14 state; 15 (viii) "State" means the state of Wyoming and 16 17 any authority, board, commission, department, division or separate operating agency of the executive, legislative or 18

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13 (a) The state shall not deny or interfere with a

14 person's right to have an abortion:

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16 (i) Prior to viability of the fetus; or

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18 (ii) To protect the pregnant woman's life or

19 health.

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21 (b) A physician, physician assistant, advanced

22 practice registered nurse or other health care provider

- 1 acting within the provider's scope of practice may
- 2 terminate a pregnancy as permitted by this act.

- 4 (c) A health care provider may assist a physician,
- 5 physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse or
- 6 other health care provider acting within the health care

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10 35-6-144. Unauthorized abortions; penalty.

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- 12 (a) Any person who provides medical treatment,
- 13 provides medication or performs a procedure intended to
- 14 induce the termination of a pregnancy not authorized by
- 15 this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 16 imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a fine not to
- 17 exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or both.

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- 19 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this
- 20 section, the state shall not penalize, prosecute or
- 21 otherwise take adverse action against a person for aiding
- 22 or assisting a person seeking an abortion in exercising the

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23 person's right to have an abortion under this act.

- 2 (c) Nothing in this act shall be construed to subject
- 3 a person upon whom any abortion is performed or attempted
- 4 to any criminal penalty under this act.

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6 35-6-145. Defense to prosecution.

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- 8 The good faith judgment of a physician, physician
- 9 assistant, advanced practice registered nurse or other
- 10 health care provider acting within the provider's scope of
- 11 practice as to viability of the fetus or as to the risk to
- 12 the life or health of a person seeking an abortion shall be
- 13 a complete defense in any civil or criminal proceeding for
- 14 a violation of this act.

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- 18 (a) Any regulation promulgated by the state relating
- 19 to abortion shall be valid only if the regulation is:

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21 (i) Medically necessary to protect the life or

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22 health of the person seeking an abortion; and

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1 (ii) Consistent with established medical 2 practice. 3 4 35-6-147. Refusing to participate in an abortion. 5 (a) No person or private medical facility shall be 6 required by law or contract to participate in the attempt 7 to perform or performance of an abortion if the person or 8 9 private medical facility objects to participating in the 10 attempt to perform or performance of an abortion. 11 12 (b) No person shall be discriminated against in employment or professional privileges because of 13 person's participation or refusal to participate in the 14 attempt to perform or performance of an abortion. 15 16 17 35-6-148. State provided benefits. 18 19 If the state provides, directly or by contract, maternity 20 care benefits, services or information through any program 21 administered or funded in whole or in part by the state,

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the state shall also provide persons otherwise eligible for

the program with substantially equivalent benefits,

1 services or information to permit them to voluntarily

2 terminate their pregnancies.

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4 35-6-149. Construction.

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6 This act shall not be construed to define the state's

7 interest in the fetus for any purpose other than those

8 purposes expressly provided in this act.

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10 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-16-1801 and 35-6-120 through

11 35-6-139 are repealed.

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13 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon

14 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

15 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

16 Constitution.
