A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming Occupational Health and
- 2 Safety Act; providing for an increase in fines and civil
- 3 penalties as specified; providing for periodic adjustment
- 4 of civil penalties; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 27-11-107(b) through (d), (f), (g)
- 9 and by creating a new subsection (j) is amended to read:

11 **27-11-107.** Penalty.

- 13 (b) Any employer willfully and knowingly violating
- 14 any of the provisions of this act, any safety and health
- 15 standards, rules or regulations promulgated under this act
- 16 or any existing rule or regulation governing the conditions

of employment promulgated by the commission may be assessed 1 2 a civil penalty of not less than five thousand dollars 3 (\$5,000.00) eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) nor more 4 than seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000.00) one hundred 5 twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000.00) for each violation, provided that a lesser penalty may be imposed by the 6 commission. If the violation causes the death of an 7 employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to 8 9 not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) nor more 10 than two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for 11 the violation, except that for an employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees the minimum penalty shall not be 12 13 less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for the 14 violation.

(c) Any employer violating any provision of this act, any health and safety standards or rules and regulations promulgated under this act or any existing rule or regulation governing the conditions of employment promulgated by the commission, the violation specifically determined to be of a serious nature, shall be assessed a civil penalty of not more than seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for the violation. If the violation causes the death of an

1 employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to

2 not less than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) nor more

3 than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the violation,

4 except that for an employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer

5 employees the minimum penalty shall not be less than ten

6 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the violation.

7

Any employer violating any provision of this act, 8 9 any health and safety standards or rules and regulations 10 promulgated under this act or any existing 11 regulation governing the conditions of employment promulgated by the commission, the violation determined not 12 to be of a serious nature, may be assessed a civil penalty 13 of not more than seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve 14 thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for each offense as noted in 15 the notice of violation. If the violation causes the death 16 17 employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to not less than twenty thousand dollars 18 19 (\$20,000.00) nor more than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) for the violation, except that for an employer 20 21 with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees the minimum penalty shall not be less than ten thousand dollars 22

(\$10,000.00) for the violation.

(f) Any employer who violates any of the posting requirements, as prescribed under the provisions of this act, may be assessed a civil penalty of up to seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for each violation.

(q) Any employer who fails to correct a violation for 7 which a notice of violation has been issued, which notice 8 9 of violation is not contested or appealed under W.S. 27-11-104 and 27-11-106, initiated by the employer, may be 10 assessed a civil penalty of not more than seven thousand 11 dollars (\$7,000.00) twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) 12 13 for each day the failure or violation continues. If the 14 violation causes the death of an employee, the civil penalty amounts shall be increased to not less than twenty 15 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) nor more than fifty thousand 16 17 dollars (\$50,000.00) for the violation, except that for an employer with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees the 18 19 minimum penalty shall not be less than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for the violation. 20

(j) Amounts provided under this section for civil penalties shall be adjusted by the commission at least once during each four (4) year period beginning July 1, 2011 to

account for the percentage increase or decrease in the

consumer price index for all urban consumers during that

period.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2011.
