1 to allow geologic sequestration activities; liability 2 generally. 3 4 (c) The rights, benefits, burdens and liabilities 5 associated with the injection of carbon dioxide, and other 6 substances injected incidental to the injection of carbon dioxide, into geologic sequestration sites for the purpose 7 8 of geologic sequestration shall include the opportunity afforded each owner of pore space to utilize that pore 9 10 space so far as it is reasonably practicable to do so, even though his operations may cause migration of the injected 11 12 substances into the land of another. 13 14 35-11-314. Unitization of geologic sequestration sites; purposes; definitions. 15 16 (b) Except when context otherwise requires or when 17 otherwise defined in this subsection, the terms used or 18 19 defined in W.S. 35-11-103, shall have the same meaning when 20 used in W.S. 35-11-314 through 35-11-317. 1 (i) "Corresponding rights" means the opportunity 2 afforded each owner of pore space to utilize his just and 3 equitable share of the common reservoir so far as it is 4 reasonably practicable to do so, and the right of all pore space owners in a unit area who will be affected by unit 5 operations, either now or in the future, to concurrently 6 share in the economic benefits generated by using the pore 7 8 space in the unit area. 9 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 10 11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 13 14 15 (END)
