and the state auditor shall direct provide a no interest loan from the state's risk management pool to the department of administration and information construction management within the general services division department they determine the governor directs and determines necessary for repairs and renovation to the Wyoming state veterinary biosafety level III laboratory in order to achieve registration by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention under the federal select agent program for possession, use and transfer of select agents and toxins. The construction management department may expend the necessary to fully commission the funds as laboratory space. Proceeds collected from insurers and third parties for the repairs shall be used to repay the loan. The attorney general, department of administration and information and University of Wyoming shall coordinate efforts to recover damages to the Wyoming state veterinary biosafety level III laboratory.
