A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to campaign finance; repealing restrictions
- 2 on organizations making independent expenditures to
- 3 advocate the election or defeat of a candidate; providing a
- 4 definition; conforming state law to a United States Supreme
- 5 Court ruling; requiring notification in advertising; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-25-102(a), (b) and by creating a
- 11 new subsection (k) and 22-25-110(a) are amended to read:

- 13 22-25-102. Contribution of funds or election
- 14 assistance restricted; limitation on contributions; right
- 15 to communicate; civil penalty.

1 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, no organization of any kind including a corporation, 2 3 partnership, trade union, professional association civic, fraternal or religious group or other profit or 4 5 nonprofit entity except a political party, political action committee or candidate's campaign committee organized under 6 W.S. 22-25-101, directly or indirectly through any officer, 7 member, director or employee, shall contribute funds, other 8 9 items of value or election assistance directly to aid, promote or prevent the nomination or election of any 10 11 candidate or group of candidates. or to aid or promote the interests, success or defeat of any political party. No 12 13 person shall solicit or receive a payment or contribution from an organization prohibited from making contributions 14 under this subsection. 15

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only a natural person, political party, or a political action committee or a candidate's campaign committee organized under W.S. 22-25-101 shall contribute funds or election assistance in order to aid, promote or prevent the nomination or election of directly to any candidate or group of candidates., or in order to aid or promote the interests, success or defeat of any political party. No

1 person shall solicit or receive a political payment or

- 2 contribution from any source other than a natural person,
- 3 political party, political action committee or candidate's
- 4 campaign committee organized under W.S. 22-25-101.

- 6 (k) The prohibitions in this section shall not be
- 7 construed to prohibit any organization of any kind
- 8 including a corporation, partnership, trade union,
- 9 professional association or civic, fraternal or religious
- 10 group or other profit or nonprofit entity from exercising
- 11 its first amendment rights to make independent expenditures
- 12 for speech expressly advocating the election or defeat of a
- 13 candidate. For purposes of this subsection, "independent
- 14 expenditure" means an expenditure that is made without
- 15 consultation or coordination with a candidate or an agent
- 16 of a candidate whose nomination or election the expenditure
- 17 supports or whose opponent's nomination or election the
- 18 expenditure opposes.

- 23 (a) It is unlawful for a candidate, political action
- 24 committee, organization, including organizations making

1 expenditures pursuant to W.S. 22-25-102(k), candidate's

2 campaign committee, or any political party central

3 committee to pay for campaign literature or campaign

4 advertising in any communication medium without printing or

5 announcing the candidate, organization or committee

6 sponsoring the campaign advertising or campaign literature.

7 The communications media in using the campaign advertising

8 shall print or announce the name of the candidate,

9 organization or committee paying for the advertising.

11 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
