9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-11-102(a), 19-11-103(a)(ix) and

12 (xi), 19-11-105(e)(iv)(intro) and 19-11-108(a), (b) and (e)

13 are amended to read:

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15 **19-11-102**. **Purpose**.

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2 (a) In order to provide for, strengthen and expedite 3 the national security under conditions which threaten the 4 peace and security of the United States and to enable those citizens of this state who perform service in the uniformed 5 services to more successfully devote their entire energy to 6 the needs of the nation and state, provision is hereby made 7 8 to provide reemployment rights and other benefits for 9 persons who perform service in the uniformed services. of 10 the United States. It is herein declared to be the policy of the state of Wyoming that its citizens who serve their 11 12 country and state in the uniformed services and who leave 13 their employment, homes and education shall not be penalized nor economically disadvantaged because of such 14 15 service.

17 **19-11-103.** Definitions.

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19 (a) As used in this article, unless the context 20 clearly requires otherwise:

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22 (ix) "Service in the uniformed services" means 23 the performance of duty on a voluntary or involuntary basis

1	in a uniformed service under competent authority and
2	includes active duty, active duty for training, initial
3	active duty for training, inactive duty training, full-time
4	national guard duty, a period for which a person is absent
5	from a position of employment for the purpose of an
6	examination to determine the fitness of the person to
7	perform any such duty and active state service by members
8	of the national guard of any state who are activated
9	pursuant to a call of $\frac{\text{the}}{\text{a}}$ governor as provided for by
10	law;

12	(xi) "Uniformed services" means the armed
13	forces, the army national guard and the air national guard
14	of any state, the commissioned corps of the public health
15	service and any other category of persons designated by the
16	president in time of war or emergency;

20	(e) For purposes of this section:

22	(iv) "Prevailing party" means any current or
23	former member of the Wyoming national guard uniformed

- 6 19-11-108. Leave of absence for state, city or county
- 7 officers and employees; training programs.

- 9 (a) Any member of the Wyoming national guard of any
- 10 state or United States military forces reserve who is an
- 11 officer or employee of this state or any political
- 12 subdivision, municipal corporation or any public agency or
- 13 entity of the state, including community colleges, shall
- 14 be given a military leave of absence with pay at the
- 15 regular salary or wage which the employee normally
- 16 receives, not to exceed fifteen (15) calendar days in any
- 17 one (1) calendar year to perform service in the uniformed
- 18 services in addition to any other leave or vacation time to
- 19 which the person is otherwise entitled.

- 21 (b) Subject to the conditions prescribed in
- 22 paragraphs (c)(i) through (v) of this section, any officer
- 23 or employee of the state or any political subdivision,

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municipal corporation or public agency of the state who has 1 2 been employed for one (1) year and who is a member of the national guard of any state or any other component of the 3 4 military forces of the a state, a member of the reserve forces of the United States or who is inducted into the 5 military service of the United States, is entitled to leave 6 of absence from his public office or employment without pay 7 8 but without loss of seniority, status, efficiency rating, vacation, sick leave or other benefits while he is engaged 9 10 in active military training or service ordered or 11 authorized by proper authority pursuant to law exceeding 12 fifteen (15) days in any calendar year. Such leave is in 13 addition to any other military leave or vacation time to 14 which the officer or employee may be entitled by law if the 15 required military service is satisfactorily performed, 16 which is presumed unless the contrary is established.

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18 (e) This section shall be liberally construed in
19 favor of the member of the Wyoming national guard of any
20 state or United States military forces who is an officer or
21 employee of this state or any political subdivision,
22 municipal corporation or any public agency of the this
23 state.
