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9	Section 1. W.S. 6-1-104(a)(vi)(P), 7-2-101(a)(iv)(G),
10	7-2-106(e)(ii) and 35-7-1002(a)(xxiv) are amended to read:

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14	(a) As used in this act, unless otherwise defined:
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1 (vi) "Peace officer" includes the following 2 officers assigned to duty in the state of Wyoming: 3 4 (P) Any superintendent, assistant superintendent, or full-time district manager, park ranger 5 or reserve park ranger of any state park, state recreation 6 area, state archeological site or state historic site who 7 8 has qualified pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707;7 9 when acting within the boundaries of the state park, state 10 recreation area, state archeological site or state historic 11 site or when responding to a request to assist other peace 12 officers acting within the scope of their official duties in their own jurisdiction; 13 14 7-2-101. Definitions. 15 16 17 (a) As used in W.S. 7-2-101 through 7-2-107: 18 (iv) "Peace officer" means: 19 20 21 (G) Any superintendent, assistant superintendent, or full-time district manager, park ranger 22 23 or reserve park ranger of any state park, state recreation

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area, state archeological site or state historic site who 1 2 has qualified pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707;7 3 when acting within the boundaries of the state park, state 4 recreation area, state archeological site or state historic site, or when responding to a request to assist other peace 5 6 officers performing their official duties; 7 8 7-2-106. Extraterritorial authority of peace officers; requests for assignment of peace officers; 9 10 liability; compensation. 11 12 (e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize a peace officer: 13 14 (ii) As defined in W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv)(E) or (G)15 16 to act pursuant to paragraph (a)(ii) or (iii) or subsection 17 (b) of this section; or 18 19 35-7-1002. Definitions. 20 21 (a) As used in this act:

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(xxiv) "Law enforcement officer" means 2 any 3 sheriff, undersheriff or sheriff's deputy of any county of 4 this state, any duly authorized municipal policeman of any city or town of this state, any member of the Wyoming 5 highway patrol, any police officer of the University of 6 Wyoming or any Wyoming community college who is a peace 7 8 officer, any superintendent, assistant superintendent, or full-time district manager, park ranger or reserve park 9 10 ranger of a state park, state recreation area, state 11 archeological site or state historic site who has qualified 12 pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707, when acting within the boundaries of the state park, state recreation 13 14 area, state archeological site or state historic site or 15 when responding to a request to assist other law 16 enforcement officers acting within the scope of their 17 official duties in their own jurisdiction, or any special 18 agent employed by the commissioner under this act;

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Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon
completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
Constitution.
