## A BILL

## for

1	AN ACT relating to livestock; amending provisions for
2	reimbursement to livestock producers; creating a
3	reimbursement account; conforming provisions; and providing
4	for an effective date.
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6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	<b>Section 1.</b> W.S. 11-19-106(a), (b)(i), (c) and by
9	creating new subsections (f) and (g), 11-19-214 and
10	11-19-406 are amended to read:
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12	11-19-106. Removal of diseased animals; owner's
13	claims.
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15	(a) All claims against the state arising from the

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1 veterinarian for scrapies, brucellosis and tuberculosis, together with the order of the veterinarian, shall be 2 3 submitted to the state auditor who shall examine them without unnecessary delay. For purposes of this section, 4 5 "disposal" means to sell, send to slaughter or destroy the animal. For each claim he finds to be equitable and 6 entitled to indemnity under this chapter the auditor shall 7 issue his warrant on the state treasurer for the sum named 8 9 in the claim. All claims for indemnity arising under the 10 provisions of this chapter, before they are presented for 11 payment to the auditor, shall be submitted to the state veterinarian who shall fully inform himself of the facts 12 13 connected with each claim. The state veterinarian shall 14 endorse on each claim his approval or rejection and shall express in such endorsement the reasons for his approval or 15 rejection. 16

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If the state veterinarian rejects a claim it and 18 (b) the reasons for rejection shall be submitted to a board of 19 arbitration consisting of three (3) members selected as 20 21 follows:

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The state veterinarian shall select one (1) 23 (i) stock grower who is a resident of the county where the 24

slaughtered ordered disposed animal for which the claim is 1 2 made ranged;

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(C) The indemnity granted shall be the fair market 4 5 value of the Prior to state veterinarian endorsing any payment be made for the ordered disposal of any livestock 6 as determined by the department of agriculture under this 7 section, W.S. 11-19-214 or 11-19-406, the state 8 9 veterinarian shall ascertain that sufficient funds are The state veterinarian shall utilize available 10 available. federal funds prior to state funds to pay the owner of the 11 livestock. The indemnity granted shall be the difference 12 13 between the fair market value of the livestock and the 14 amount received for the sale, less any amount of reimbursement provided for and paid under federal law and 15 regulation. Fair market value shall be determined by using 16 17 comparable sales data from state markets at the time of removal or by the use of a qualified independent livestock 18 appraiser as designated by the state veterinarian. If no 19 sale is transacted, but an animal is removed for diagnostic 20 21 purposes or disposal, the reimbursement provided shall be 22 the fair market value minus any other reimbursement. 23 Unless otherwise reimbursed, the cost of shipping or 24 transportation and commission charges shall be added to the

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1 amount provided to the producer for livestock 2 indemnification. It shall be paid to the owner upon his 3 application and presentation of proofs prescribed herein 4 within six (6) months of the date of slaughter ordered 5 disposal for which payment is claimed. The claim shall be barred if not presented within the time limited. 6 7 (f) The Wyoming livestock board, in consultation with 8 9 the state veterinarian, shall promulgate rules and regulations for the processing of claims under this 10 section. 11 12 13 (q) There is created the animal reimbursement program 14 account into which shall be deposited revenues as provided by law. Interest on earnings from funds in the account 15 shall be credited to the account. Deposits into the account 16 17 shall only be expended pursuant to this section and the rules and regulations as required by subsection (d) of this 18 19 section. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008 or 9-4-207, unexpended funds shall not revert. The state veterinarian 20 21 shall report the balance of the account and the claims 22 endorsed and paid each fiscal year to the joint

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appropriations interim committee and the joint agriculture,

1 state and public lands and water resources interim committee on or before September 15 of the succeeding year. 2 3 4 11-19-214. Sale of diseased livestock. 5

All livestock in Wyoming lawfully found to be affected with 6 tuberculosis may be shipped or transported under the 7 direction of the state veterinarian in accordance with 8 9 federal regulations, to livestock markets and there sold 10 for salvage and destroyed or transferred to an approved slaughter facility or veterinary diagnostic laboratory in 11 accordance with federal regulations. Prior to directing 12 that any affected livestock be sold under this section, the 13 state veterinarian shall ascertain that sufficient funds 14 are available from either federal or state sources to 15 ensure that the owner of condemned livestock will be paid 16 17 the difference between the market value at the time of quarantine and the amount received for the sale, less any 18 19 amount of reimbursement provided for and paid under federal law or regulation, the cost of shipping or transportation 20 21 and commission charges Producers may be eligible for indemnification as provided in W.S. 11-19-106 for any 22 livestock ordered disposed pursuant to this section. 23

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11-19-406. Sale of diseased cattle or domestic bison.
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3 All cattle or domestic bison in Wyoming lawfully found to 4 be affected with brucellosis, including all sexually intact 5 cattle or domestic bison that are part of a herd found to be affected with brucellosis, may be shipped or transported 6 under the direction of the state veterinarian to livestock 7 markets and sold for immediate slaughter or transferred to 8 9 an approved slaughter facility or veterinary diagnostic 10 laboratory in accordance with federal regulations. Prior 11 to directing that any cattle or bison that are part of an infected herd be sold under this section, the state 12 13 veterinarian shall ascertain that sufficient funds are 14 available from either federal or state sources to ensure that the owner of the condemned cattle or domestic bison 15 will be paid the difference between the market value at the 16 17 time of quarantine and the amount received for the sale, less any amount of reimbursement provided for and paid 18 19 under federal law or regulation, the cost of shipping or transportation and commission charges. Payments under this 20 21 section shall not be made by the state for any sexually 22 intact female cattle or bison which are over twelve (12) months old and which are not official calfhood vaccinates 23 24 as provided in board rule and regulation. Producers may be

1	eligible for indemnification in accordance with W.S.
2	11-19-106 for any livestock ordered disposed pursuant to
3	this section.
