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15 31-7-109. Classes of licenses.

1 2 (d) Licensing classification plan: 3 4 (iii) Class "C" consists of any single vehicle or combination of vehicles, except motorcycles, that does 5 not meet the definition of class "A" or class "B" vehicles 6 under this subsection, but that is not designed to 7 8 transport sixteen (16) or more passengers including the 9 driver or is not placarded for transportation of hazardous 10 materials require a commercial driver's license. Any 11 person under the age of eighteen (18) is prohibited from 12 operating a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of 13 twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or more; 14 15 The following driver's license endorsements are 16 special authorizations permitting the driver to operate certain types of motor vehicles or transport certain types 17 18 of cargo if the endorsement is displayed on the driver 19 license: 20 21 (viii) "Z" authorizes the holder of a class C 22 license under subsection (d) of this section to operate a 23 vehicle or combination of vehicles which have a gross

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1	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act,
2	the department shall by rule and regulation grant an
3	exemption from the licensing requirements of this article

6	article to a class of persons or class of commercial motor
7	vehicles exempted by the secretary of the United States

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1 (C) used in the operations of Not 2 contract or common motor carrier; - and 3 4 (ii) Firefighting equipment Firefighters and 5 other persons who operate commercial motor vehicles which 6 are necessary to the preservation of life or property or the execution of emergency governmental functions, are 7 8 equipped with audible and visual signals and are not 9 subject to normal traffic regulation. These vehicles 10 include fire trucks, hook and ladder trucks, foam or water 11 transport trucks, police special weapons and tactics team 12 vehicles, ambulances or other vehicles that are used in 13 response to emergencies; 14 15 (iii) Individuals who operate commercial motor 16 vehicles for military equipment operated by the department of defense, including the national guard, when operated by 17 18 noncivilian personnel purposes. This exception is 19 applicable to active duty military personnel, members of 20 the military reserves, members of the national guard on 21 active duty, including personnel on full-time national 22 quard duty, personnel on part-time national quard training, 23 civilian national guard military technicians who

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required to wear military uniforms and active duty United

States coast guard personnel.

Section 2. W.S. 31-7-109(d)(i), (ii), (h)(ii), (iv)

and (vi) is repealed.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2015.
