A BILL

1 AN ACT relating to elections; amending provisions related 2 to the election of precinct committeemen and

3 committeewomen; amending the certification and notice

4 requirements for precinct elections; establishing a term of

5 office; amending county central committee meeting

6 requirements; specifying those precinct committeemen and

7 committeewomen who qualify to vote to fill vacancies in

8 office; and providing for an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-4-101(b) and by creating new

13 subsections (d) and (e), 22-4-104 and 22-18-111(a)(iii)(A)

14 are amended to read:

1 22-4-101. Application; composition, election and

2 qualifications of county central committees; certificate of

3 election.

The county central committee of each political party consists of precinct committeemen and committeewomen 6 elected in the county at the regular biennial primary 7 8 election. Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, each political party in each precinct shall elect 9 one (1) committeeman and one (1) committeewoman for each 10 11 two hundred fifty (250) votes or major fraction thereof 12 cast for the party's candidate for representative in 13 congress in the last general election, but provided that no precinct shall be entitled to less than one (1) precinct 14 15 precinct committeewoman. committeeman and Precinct 16 committeemen and committeewomen shall be electors registered in the party and resident in the precinct. The 17 county clerk shall issue a certificate of election to the 18 19 precinct committeemen and committeewomen elected and 20 concurrently notify the county central committee chairman. 21 The certificate shall state the term of office which shall 22 begin on the day the primary election is canvassed and 23 shall expire on the date the next regular biennial primary

election is canvassed. If a precinct boundary line is 1 2 changed for any reason, the county commissioners shall 3 determine the number of precinct committeemen and 4 committeewomen to which the affected precinct is entitled. 5 6 (d) No later than forty-five (45) days after the date of the primary election, the county canvassing board or a 7 8 canvassing board appointed by the county clerk consisting 9 of two (2) electors and the county clerk, shall provide to 10 each county chairman the certified election results for 11 precinct committeemen and committeewomen and a list of 12 persons who received write-in votes for precinct 13 committeemen or committeewomen, if those write-in votes 14 resulted in a tie. 15 16 (e) Except for the term beginning after the canvass of the 2014 primary election, the term of office for all 17 18 precinct committeemen and committeewomen shall be two (2) 19 years and shall begin on the first Monday in January of the

year following their election. The term for committeemen

and committeewomen elected at the 2014 primary election

shall end on the first Monday in January of 2017.

10 (iii) If a vacancy occurs in the office of a

11 member of the state legislature:

13 (A) For vacancies other than resignations,

14 the board of county commissioners of the county or counties

15 in which the vacancy occurs shall immediately notify in

16 writing the chairman of the state central committee of the

17 political party which the former incumbent represented at

18 the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or at

19 the time of his appointment if not elected to office. For

20 resignations, the governor shall notify the appropriate

21 state central committee or the appropriate board of county

22 commissioners in accordance with W.S. 28-1-106. For all

23 vacancies in which the incumbent represented a political

party at the time of his election or appointment to the 1 2 office, the state central committee of the political party 3 former incumbent shall notify the precinct 4 committeemen and committeewomen for that party for each precinct within the legislative district which is vacant 5 and arrange a meeting of those precinct committeemen and 6 committeewomen at which they will select a list of three 7 8 (3) persons qualified to fill the vacancy. Only those persons serving as committeemen and committeewomen at least 9 10 thirty (30) days prior to the vacancy, or if the vacancy occurs within thirty (30) days after a primary election, 11 12 including precinct committeemen and committeewomen elected 13 at that primary the first Monday in January in odd-numbered 14 years, those precinct committeemen and committeewomen elected at the immediate past primary election and those 15 16 selected prior to December 2 of the year in which the election occurred for vacant positions, shall be authorized 17 to vote under this subparagraph. The meeting shall be held 18 19 not later than fifteen (15) days after the state central 20 committee is notified of the vacancy. The state central 21 committee of each political party shall establish 22 procedures for conducting the vote required under this
