1 AN ACT relating to the licensure of denturists; creating a board of denturists; regulating the practice of denturism; 2 providing for licensing, fees, examinations and other 3 regulation of denturists; repealing prohibition 4 on 5 soliciting for denturism services; providing criminal penalties for violations of denturist act; providing 6 7 definitions; and providing for an effective date. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 33-15-201 through 33-15-217 are 11 created to read: 12 13 CHAPTER 15 14 15 DENTISTS, DENTAL HYGIENISTS AND DENTURISTS 16

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4	33-15-201. Definitions.									
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6	(a) As used in this article:									
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8	(i) "Board" means the Wyoming board of									
9	denturists;									
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11	(ii) "Denture" means a removable full or partial									
12	upper or lower dental appliance to be worn in the mouth to									
13	replace the missing natural teeth;									
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15	(iii) "Denturist" means a person licensed under									
16	this article to engage in the practice of denturism;									
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18	(iv) "Practice of denturism" means:									
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20	(A) Making, placing, constructing,									
21	altering, reproducing or repairing a denture; and									
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1 (B) Taking impressions and furnishing or supplying a denture directly to a person or advising the 2 use of a denture and maintaining a facility for the same. 3 4 5 (b) This article may be cited as the "Wyoming Denture Practice Act". 6 7 33-15-202. Board of denturists; rulemaking. 8 9 10 There is created the Wyoming board of denturists. (a) 11 The board shall carry out the purposes and enforce the provisions of this article. The board shall consist of 12 five (5) members appointed by the governor with the advice 13 and consent of the senate. Appointments made between 14 sessions of the legislature shall be made in accordance 15 with W.S. 28-12-101. 16 17 (b) The term for board members is four (4) years and 18 shall be in accordance with W.S. 28-12-101 19 through 20 28-12-103. 21 22 (c) The board shall consist of: 23 24 (i) Three (3) practicing denturists; 3

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(ii) One (1) practicing dentist; and 2 3 (iii) One (1) member of the public. 4 5 The governor may remove any member as provided in 6 (d) W.S. 9-1-202. Any vacancy on the board caused by the 7 resignation, death or removal of a member shall be filled 8 9 by the governor by appointment for the unexpired term of 10 that member. Any appointment to fill a vacancy shall be 11 made within ninety (90) days after the vacancy occurs. 12 13 Each member of the board shall, before entering (e) upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe an oath 14 or affirmation that he will support the constitution and 15 the laws of the United States and the state of Wyoming, and 16 17 that he will faithfully perform the duties as a member of the board. 18 19 (f) board shall elect from its 20 The members a 21 president, vice-president and a secretary-treasurer. The board shall have a common seal. The board shall meet in 22 June each year, and more often if necessary, at such times 23

24 and places designated by the board. The meeting of the

1 board shall be at the call of the president and the 2 secretary-treasurer. Five (5) days notice shall be given 3 by the secretary-treasurer to all board members of the time 4 and place of the meeting. A majority of the board 5 constitutes a quorum.

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The board shall not create any indebtedness on 7 (q) behalf of the state of Wyoming, except as provided in this 8 9 section. Out of the funds assessed by the board, each of the members of the board shall receive compensation for 10 11 each day or part of a day in which they are engaged in performance of their official duties at the same rate as 12 13 state legislators and shall be reimbursed for actual and 14 necessary expenses, and mileage incurred in the performance of their official duties. 15

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(h) The board may make, adopt, amend, repeal and
enforce reasonable rules and regulations necessary for the
proper administration of this article.

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(j) The board shall report annually to the governor respecting all activities, as required by W.S. 9-2-1014.

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24 33-15-203. Denturists; generally.

2 (a) Before making and fitting a denture, a denturist3 shall examine the patient's oral cavity.

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5 (b) If the examination gives the denturist reasonable cause to believe that there is an abnormality or disease 6 process that requires medical or dental treatment, the 7 denturist shall immediately refer the patient to a dentist 8 9 or physician. In such cases, the denturist shall take no further action to manufacture or place a denture until the 10 patient has been examined by a dentist or physician and the 11 dentist or physician gives written clearance that 12 the 13 denture will pose no threat to the patient's health.

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15 (c) If the examination reveals the need for tissue or 16 teeth modification in order to assure proper fit of a full 17 or partial denture, the denturist shall refer the patient 18 to a dentist and assure that the modification has been 19 completed before taking an impression for the completion of 20 the denture.

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(d) Any denturist who makes or places a denture in a manner not consistent with this section is subject to the sanctions provided under this article.

1 2 (e) A denturist shall successfully complete special 3 training in oral pathology prescribed by the board, whether 4 as part of an approved associates degree program or 5 equivalent training, and pass an examination prescribed by the board, which may be a part of the examination for 6 licensure to become a licensed denturist. 7 8 33-15-204. Qualifications. 9 10 11 No person may represent himself as a licensed denturist or use any title or description of denturism services without 12 13 applying for licensure, meeting the required qualifications and being licensed as a denturist by the board, unless 14 otherwise exempted by this article. 15 16 17 33-15-205. Exemptions. 18 Nothing in this article prohibits or restricts: 19 (a) 20 21 (i) The practice of a profession by an 22 individual who is licensed, certified or registered under other laws of this state and who is performing services 23 24 within the authorized scope of practice;

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1 2 (ii) The practice of denturism by an individual employed by the government of the United States while the 3 4 individual is engaged in the performance of duties 5 prescribed by the laws and regulations of the United States; 6 7 (iii) The practice of denturism by students 8 9 enrolled in a school approved by the board. The performance of services shall be pursuant to a course of 10 instruction or an assignment from an instructor and under 11 the supervision of an instructor; or 12 13 (iv) Work performed by dental labs and dental 14 technicians under the written prescription of a dentist. 15 16 33-15-206. Determination of fees. 17 18 board shall determine, in accordance with W.S. 19 The 20 33-1-201, each year the fees to be collected for 21 examinations, reexaminations, licensure and renewals. 22 33-15-207. Reciprocity; licensing. 23 24

1 (a) The board shall issue a license to practice 2 denturism to an applicant who submits a completed 3 application, pays the appropriate fees, and meets the 4 following requirements:

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6 (i) A person currently licensed to practice 7 denturism under statutory provisions of another state, 8 territory of the United States, District of Columbia or 9 Puerto Rico, with substantially equivalent licensing 10 standards to this article applicable to denturism shall be 11 licensed without examination upon providing the board with 12 the following:

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14 (A) Proof of successfully passing a written and clinical examination for denturism in a state, 15 territory of the United States, District of Columbia or 16 17 Puerto Rico, that the board has determined has substantially equivalent licensing standards as those in 18 this article, including but not limited to both the written 19 and clinical examination; and 20

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(B) An affidavit from the licensing agency
where the person is licensed or certified attesting to the
fact of the person's licensure or certification.

1 2 (b) A person graduating from a formal denturism 3 program shall be licensed if he: 4 5 (i) Documents successful completion of formal training with a major course of study in denturism of not 6 less than two (2) years in duration at an educational 7 institution approved by the board; 8 9 (ii) Passes a written and clinical examination 10 11 approved by the board; and 12 13 (iii) Pays the appropriate fees. 14 15 33-15-208. Examinations. 16 The board of dental examiners shall administer 17 (a) the examinations for licensing denturists under this 18 article, subject to the following requirements: 19 20 21 (i) Examinations shall determine the 22 qualifications, fitness and ability of the applicant to practice denturism. The test shall include a written 23 examination and a practical demonstration of skills; 24

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10	(v) The applicant shall be informed in writing							
11	by certified mail of the results of his examination within							
12	thirty (30) days after the examination. An applicant who							
13	fails an examination may apply to the board for a							
14	reexamination at the next scheduled examination meeting.							
15	Application shall be made in writing and shall be							
16	accompanied by a fee as provided in subsection (c) of this							
17	section;							
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19	(vi) If the applicant fails the board							
20	examination three (3) times, he shall show evidence of							
21	additional education to the satisfaction of the board							
22	before he may be reexamined.							

(b) The board may hire trained persons licensed under 1 2 article to prepare, administer and this qrade the 3 examinations or may contract with regional examiners who 4 meet qualifications adopted by the board. 5 The examination fee shall be set by the board 6 (C) each year, and all reexamination fees shall be the same as 7 the current fee for the initial examination. Fees shall be 8 9 paid to the secretary of the board before examination. The fee shall be paid by money order, cashiers' check or 10 certified check, and in no case shall the fee be refunded. 11 12 13 33-15-209. License content. 14 administrative procedures, administrative 15 (a) The requirements and fees for denturism shall be determined by 16 17 the board as provided for under this article. 18 license shall contain, on its face, 19 (b) The the 20 address and addresses where the license holder will perform 21 the denturist services.

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23 33-15-210. Renewal license.

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The board shall establish by rule the requirement for 1 2 renewal of licenses to practice denturism, but shall not 3 increase the licensure requirements provided for denturism 4 in this article. 5 33-15-211. Grounds and procedure for revocation or 6 suspension of license. 7 8 9 Any denturist may have his license revoked or (a) 10 suspended by the board for any of the following causes: 11 12 (i) Conviction of a felony or high misdemeanor 13 involving moral turpitude, in which case the record of conviction certified by the clerk or judge of the court in 14 which the conviction is had is conclusive evidence; 15 16 17 (ii) For renting or loaning to any person his license or diploma to be used as a license or diploma for 18 such person; 19 20 21 (iii) For unprofessional conduct, advertising or 22 soliciting patients in any form of communication in a manner that is false or misleading in any material respect; 23 24 or

2 (iv) Willful violation of any provisions of this3 article.

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5 (b) The proceedings under this section may be taken by the board from matters within its knowledge or upon 6 information from another. If the informant is a member of 7 the board, the other members of the board shall take action 8 9 on behalf of the board. All complaints shall be in writing, verified by a party familiar with the facts 10 11 charged, and shall be filed with the secretary of the board. Upon receiving the complaint, the board, if it 12 deems the complaint sufficient, shall proceed as in a 13 contested case under the Wyoming Administrative Procedure 14 Act. Upon revocation of any license, the fact shall be 15 noted upon the records of the board and the license shall 16 17 be marked revoked upon the date of its revocation. The secretary of the board, upon judgment of suspension or 18 revocation being entered, shall transmit to the secretary 19 of state a copy of the judgment order, certified by the 20 21 secretary of the board, and the same shall be kept in the 22 same manner as the list of licensed dentists.

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1 (C) Upon receipt from the department of family services of a certified copy of an order from a court to 2 withhold, suspend or otherwise restrict a denturist license 3 issued by the board, the board shall notify the party named 4 5 in the court order of the withholding, suspension or restriction of the license in accordance with the terms of 6 order. 7 the court No appeal under the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act shall be allowed for a license 8 9 withheld, suspended or restricted under this subsection.

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11 33-15-212. Renewal license certificate.

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13 (a) On or before December 31 of each year, each denturist licensed to practice denturism in this state, 14 upon receipt of written notice, shall transmit to the 15 secretary of the board his signature and address, together 16 17 with a fee determined by the board and the number of his receive therefor 18 license, and а renewal license certificate. Any license granted by the board shall be 19 20 cancelled after ten (10) days written notice sent to the 21 holder by registered mail if the holder fails to secure the renewal certificate within three (3) months after December 22 23 31 each year, but any license so cancelled may be restored 24 by the board upon the payment of a fee as set by the board,

if paid by December 31 of the year in which the license is
 cancelled.

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(b) Commencing January 1, 2015, any denturist whose 4 5 application for renewal indicates that he has not actively practiced denturism or engaged in teaching denturism for 6 any of the preceding five (5) years shall be issued a 7 renewal certificate by the board only after a hearing and 8 9 upon notice to the applicant, wherein the applicant demonstrates to the board that he has maintained the 10 qualifications set forth in this article. No reexamination 11 is required unless the board finds good cause to believe 12 13 that the person has not maintained the professional ability and knowledge required of an original licensee under this 14 article. 15

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17 (c) The board may set continuing education18 requirements for relicensure of denturists.

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33-15-213. Secretary of state's certificate that no
license listed by board is prima facie proof of
unauthorized practice.

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1 In any prosecution for violation of any provision of this article the certificate of the secretary of state that the 2 person accused of the violation of any of those provisions 3 is not named in the list of denturist presented to him by 4 5 the secretary of the board is prima facie proof that the person is not entitled to practice denturism in Wyoming. 6 7 33-15-214. Partnerships with dentists. 8 9 Notwithstanding any other provision of state 10 law, а licensed denturist may enter into a partnership or other 11 business association with a dentist, provided that the 12 association does not impede the independent professional 13 14 judgment of either party. 15 33-15-215. Violations. 16 17 Any person who practices denturism without being properly 18

19 qualified and licensed, or who violates any provisions of 20 this article is subject to a fine not to exceed one 21 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or imprisonment for not more 22 than two (2) years, or both. Each separate violation of 23 this article constitutes a separate offense.

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33-15-216. List of licensees filed with secretary of
 state.

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A list of all denturists licensed under this article shall 4 5 be published by the board each year. This list shall contain the name and address of each denturist and such 6 other information as the board deems advisable. 7 The board shall place a copy of the list on file in the office of the 8 9 secretary of state who shall furnish copies to the public, upon request. 10

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33-15-217. Certificate entitles denturists to
 practice in any county; lost certificates.

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15 The certificate provided for in this article entitles the 16 holder to practice denturism in any county in Wyoming. The 17 board, upon satisfactory proof of loss of the certificate 18 issued under this article, shall issue a new certificate. 19 The cost of replacement shall be determined by the board 20 and paid by the person requesting replacement.
