15	(a) A person who operates a website that disseminates

enforcement agencies as part of routinely documenting an 1 2 arrest shall remove any photograph and related name and personal information from all websites owned or controlled 3 by that person without charging a fee within thirty (30) 4 5 days of the date of a request to remove the photograph and information if the request: 6 7 (i) Is made in writing; and 8 9 (ii) Contains written documentation that 10 all 11 charges stemming from the arrest for which the photograph 12 was made: 13 14 (A) Were resolved through acquittal or otherwise without a conviction; or 15 16 17 (B) Following conviction, were expunded or set aside pursuant to court order. 18 19 (b) For purposes of this section, paper or electronic 20 21 copies of official court records or law enforcement records constitute written documentation. 22 23

(c) A person who violates subsection (a) of this 1 2 section commits an unlawful practice under W.S. 40-12-105. 3 4 Section 2. W.S. 40-12-105(a) by creating a new 5 paragraph (xvi) is amended to read: 6 7 40-12-105. Unlawful practices. 8 9 (a) A person engages in a deceptive trade practice unlawful under this act when, in the course of his business 10 and in connection with a consumer transaction, he 11 knowingly: 12 13 14 (xvi) Violates W.S. 40-12-601. 15 16 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2014. 17 18 (END)
