## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to water development projects; authorizing specified level I and level II studies; providing 2 appropriations; requiring reports; providing for reversion 3 of unexpended funds; authorizing unobligated funds to be 4 used to complete other designated projects as specified; 5 providing an appropriation for the office of water 6 programs; extending the Platte River Basin endangered 7 species account and providing an appropriation; 8 9 providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

14 [AUTHORIZED LEVEL I AND LEVEL II STUDIES]

1 Section 1. LEVEL I RECONNAISSANCE STUDIES - NEW DEVELOPMENT. The following sums of money are appropriated 2 3 from water development account I, as created by W.S. 4 41-2-124(a)(i), to the water development commission to be expended to conduct the following reconnaissance studies as 5 6 defined in W.S. 41-2-114. Funds appropriated under this 7 section for a particular project which are in excess of the actual amount necessary to complete the study may, subject 8 to the review of the select water committee, be expended by 9 10 the commission to complete the reconnaissance study for any 11 other project listed in this section. Appropriated funds 12 not obligated prior to July 1, 2021 shall revert to water 13 development account I. The commission shall submit a report 14 to the legislature on each of the following studies prior 15 to the 2020 legislative session:

In the 2015 Omnibus water 14 bill - planning, 2015 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 168, 15 Section 5, the following sums of money were appropriated 16 from water development account III, as created by W.S. 17 41-2-124(a)(iii), to the water development commission to be 18 expended to conduct the following feasibility studies as 19 defined in W.S. 41-2-114. A three (3) year time extension 20 is granted for those feasibility studies and appropriated 21 funds not obligated prior to July 1, 2021 shall revert to 22 water development account III. Section 6. The Wyoming water development commission is authorized to expend funds from water development account I, as created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i), to contract with the University of Wyoming in an amount not to exceed one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000.00) to fund the office of water programs established under W.S. 41-2-125 from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2020.

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16 Section 7. PLATTE RIVER RECOVERY IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM - EXTENSION. Three million one hundred thousand 17 18 dollars (\$3,100,000.00) is appropriated from 19 development account I, as created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i), to the Platte River Basin endangered species account for 20 21 the Wyoming water development office to fund the state of Wyoming's participation in a thirteen (13) year extension 22 of the first increment of the Platte River Recovery 2.3 24 Implementation Program (PRRIP). Any unexpended balance in the Platte River Basin endangered species account shall be 25 invested by the state treasurer and the interest earned 26

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1 shall be credited to the Platte River Basin endangered

2 species account to meet the cost of inflation over the term

3 of the extension of the first increment of PRRIP, scheduled

4 to run from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2032.

5 Expenditures for the extension under this section shall not

6 be authorized until the state of Wyoming has entered into,

7 and the governor has executed, an extension amendment to

8 the cooperative agreement with the United States Department

9 of the Interior and the states of Nebraska and Colorado.

10 Unexpended funds appropriated under this subsection and

11 those funds appropriated in 2006 Wyoming Session Laws,

12 Chapter 99, Section 6 shall revert to water development

13 account I on July 1, 2034.

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15 **Section 8.** REVERSIONS - NEW DEVELOPMENT. The

16 following feasibility study, having been suspended by the

17 water development commission, shall be cancelled and all

18 remaining funds appropriated to the commission for the

19 study, shall revert on the effective date of this act to

20 water development account I, as created by W.S.

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21 41-2-124(a)(i):
