- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-18-301 by creating new subsections
- 8 (e) and (f) is amended to read:

- 10 31-18-301. Permanent cards and decals; operation
- 11 without authority; inspections.

- 13 (e) A motor carrier which has stopped at a Wyoming
- 14 port of entry and passed all required inspections shall not
- 15 be again required to stop at that port of entry for a
- 16 period of twenty-four (24) hours if:

1	(i) No load carried by that motor carrier during
2	the twenty-four (24) hour period is more than three percent
3	(3%) heavier than the load initially checked at the port of
4	<pre>entry;</pre>
5	
6	(ii) The motor carrier's main terminal and
7	satellite terminal reside within a ten (10) mile radius of
8	a Wyoming port of entry;
9	
10	(iii) The motor carrier's loads are loaded or
11	weighed by scales certified by the department of
12	agriculture;
13	
14	(iv) The motor carrier is making multiple trips
15	to a single location and not to other locations within the
16	twenty-four (24) hour period; and

18	(v) All loads carried by the motor carrier
19	during the twenty-four (24) hour period are:

21	(A) Loaded in the same manner; and

23	(B) Comprised of the same commodity or
24	payload.

2 (f) Subsection (e) of this section shall not prevent any investigator, trooper or other authorized person from 3 4 stopping any motor carrier for any purpose permitted by 5 law. Notwithstanding subsection (e) of this section, a motor carrier may be required to return to any port of 6 7 entry pursuant to W.S. 31-18-805. 8 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2012. 9 10
