A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; creating the
2 offense of burglary for minor theft; specifying elements
3 and penalties of the offense; and providing for an
4 effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-3-301 by creating new subsections
9 (e) and (f) is amended to read:

10

11 **6-3-301. Burglary; aggravated burglary; burglary for**
12 **minor theft; penalties.**

13

14 (e) A person is guilty of burglary for minor theft
15 if, without authority, he enters or remains in a building,

1 occupied structure or vehicle, or separately secured or
2 occupied portion thereof, with intent to commit theft and:

3
4 (i) Commits no theft or commits a theft of
5 property with a value of less than one thousand dollars
6 (\$1,000.00) in the course of committing the crime;

7
8 (ii) Did not enter with intent to commit a
9 felony and commits no felony in the course of committing
10 the crime;

11
12 (iii) The building, structure or vehicle was not
13 locked and was not in fact occupied at the time of entry;
14 and

15
16 (iv) The building, structure or vehicle was not
17 designed or adapted for overnight accommodation.

18
19 (f) Burglary for minor theft is a misdemeanor
20 punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year,
21 a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00),
22 or both.

1 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2017.
