## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to medical assistance; requiring the 2 development of a design for a medical assistance program 3 for people who cannot afford adequate health care;

4 providing principles for the design as specified; requiring

5 the management council to designate an entity to develop

6 the design; requiring input from stakeholders; prohibiting

7 the submission of a request for medicaid expansion to the

8 federal government as specified; providing an

9 appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 Section 1.

Wyoming legislature's management council 1 The (a) 2 shall direct the design of a program providing medical 3 assistance to people who cannot afford adequate health 4 care. 5 The program design shall follow these principles: 6 (b) 7 8 (i) The design shall seek to maximize 9 improvements in the health status of program participants 10 given reasonably available medical and other resources and 11 shall seek to provide greater health status improvements 12 than those provided by the medicaid program; 13 14 (ii) The design, in conjunction with other 15 assistance programs, shall seek to create a pathway for 16 participants to leave governmental assistance and become 17 self-sufficient; 18 19 The design shall be coordinated with other (iii) 20 assistance programs so that participants always have an 21 incentive to improve their earnings and economic status. To achieve this end, the design may include recommended 22

changes to other government assistance programs;

2	(iv) The design shall include a work requirement
3	for participants who are able to work;
4	
5	(v) The design shall allow participation by
6	participants, if any, who are unable to work and who are
7	not eligible for health care assistance from other
8	programs, including programs associated with supplemental
9	security income (SSI);
10	
11	(vi) The design shall include incentives and
12	other mechanisms for participants and health care providers
13	to avoid unnecessary health care costs and to reduce the
14	costs of health care;
15	
16	(vii) The design shall consider the use of
17	health savings accounts or similar accounts to provide
18	incentives for appropriate cost and utilization reduction;
19	
20	(viii) The design shall consider and recommend
21	changes in the current medicaid program which would improve
22	health outcomes for current medicaid clients and reduce

medicaid cost as a means of financing or helping to finance 1 2 the medical assistance program designed under this section; 3 4 (ix) The design shall seek to avoid spending monies that Wyoming does not have and shall seek to avoid 5 the creation of any uncontrolled entitlement that may grow 6 beyond the resources Wyoming can reasonably expect to have 7 8 in the future; 9 10 (x) The design shall comply with the 11 requirements of the Wyoming Constitution, Article 16, 12 Section 6, concerning the necessary support of the poor; 13 14 (xi) The design shall seek to facilitate the 15 movement of participants from the medicaid program and the 16 medical assistance program designed under this section to private insurance including employer provided insurance and 17 18 privately purchased insurance; 19 20 (xii) The design shall consider housing the new

medical assistance program in the department of family

services, the Wyoming health insurance pool or any other

state agency and may consider moving the medicaid program 1 2 to the same entity; 3 4 (xiii) The design shall consider financing the 5 medical assistance program from savings created by operation of the program in the existing medicaid program, 6 savings in other health and welfare programs and from the 7 8 financing mechanisms available to the Wyoming health 9 insurance pool; 10 11 (xiv) The development of the design shall not be 12 unreasonably constrained by current federal health policies and requirements; 13 14 15 (xv) The design may be implemented through an 16 expansion of Wyoming's participation in the medicaid program with appropriate federal waivers or changes, as 17 part of any available medicaid block grant or as a free-18 19 standing state program. 20 Section 2. 21 22

(a) The management council may assign the development 1 2 of the design required by section 1 of this act to a joint 3 interim committee, a special or select legislative 4 committee or to a joint task force with public and 5 executive branch members. 6 (b) The management council shall set appropriate time 7 8 schedules and deadlines for the design effort which shall include a report before the 2017 general session and before 9 10 the 2018 budget session. 11 12 Section 3. 13 14 (a) The entity developing the design required by section 1 of this act shall: 15 16 17 (i) At its initial meeting or at an early meeting, seek information, advice and recommendations from 18 19 the general public and other stakeholders; 20 21 (ii) Receive assistance, advice and information 22 from the department of family services, the department of

1 insurance and Wyoming health insurance pool, the department

2 of workforce services and the department of health;

4 (iii) Request advice and recommendations from

5 the governor.

6

7 (b) The state of Wyoming shall not seek approval from

8 the federal government for an expansion of its

9 participation in the medicaid program until the design of

10 the medical assistance program has been submitted to and

11 considered by the legislature.

13 (c) The management council may authorize the use of

14 consultants or temporary or part-time employees to assist

15 in staffing and performing the functions required by this

16 act.

17

18 (d) There is appropriated from the general fund to

19 the legislative service office twenty thousand dollars

20 (\$20,000.00) for the purpose of performing the tasks

21 required in this act. This appropriation shall be expended

22 only for the purposes authorized by this act. These funds

23 shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose

1 and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

2 appropriation on June 30, 2019 shall revert as provided by

3 law.

4

5 **Section 4.** This act is effective immediately upon

6 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

7 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

8 Constitution.
