Game and fish-resident preference points.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; requiring preference
- 2 point programs for resident antelope, deer and elk
- 3 licenses; providing for fees; providing for rulemaking; and
- 4 providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-703(g), by creating a new
- 9 subsection (h) and by amending and renumbering (h) as (j)
- 10 and 23-2-101(m) are amended to read:

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- 23-1-703. Limitation of number of big or trophy game
- 13 animal licenses; reservation of certain licenses;

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14 reservation of certain unused licenses.

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1 (g)In addition to the authority granted under 2 subsection (b) of this section, the commission may shall 3 through rule and regulation develop and implement 4 preference point program for resident and nonresident 5 antelope, resident and nonresident deer and resident and nonresident elk licenses which are limited in quota and 6 would otherwise be issued through a random drawing. 7 program established pursuant to this subsection may be 8 9 implemented for all or selected hunt areas and may be applied to all or portions of licenses for any particular 10 11 species. Allocation of resident limited quota licenses for elk, deer and antelope under the preference point program 12 13 shall be as provided in subsection (h) of this section. The commission may charge nonresident license applicants a 14 nonrefundable fee to accumulate preference points under the 15 program as provided in W.S. 23-2-101(m). 16

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(h) Effective January 1, 2015, resident antelope, deer and elk licenses shall be issued partially through a preference point drawing and partially through a random drawing of all remaining unsuccessful applicants for that year. The department shall assign points to each license applicant for a specific species by multiplying the number of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a

license times one (1), but in no event shall the applicants 1 2 total points, including resident and nonresident points 3 accumulated, exceed the maximum number of points allocated 4 to resident applicants in that year. The calculation used 5 to assign points to an applicant for a particular species under this subsection shall include any year the applicant 6 7 does not apply for a big or trophy game animal hunting license for that species, provided the applicant pays the 8 9 fee specified in W.S. 23-2-101(k). License applicants 10 within each hunt area for a species shall be grouped 11 according to the number of assigned points for that species. The commission shall develop a method by which an 12 applicant may submit an application as part of a party 13 14 application with no more than two (2) youth members of his immediate family as defined in W.S. 40-14-640(a)(vi) and 15 the youth applications shall not count towards the party 16 17 application points total. If successfully drawn on first choice, all points are forfeited including any acquired by 18 19 youth. Not less than fifty percent (50%) of available licenses within any hunt area shall be randomly selected 20 21 through a preference point drawing from among the group of 22 applicants with the largest number of assigned points and 23 shall continue until all applicants within that group have 24 been exhausted or until all available licenses have been

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issued, whichever first occurs. If any applicant grouping 1 has been exhausted and licenses remain available within 2 3 that hunt area, selection shall continue from among the group of applicants with the next largest number of 4 5 assigned points. After the selections through the preference point drawing have been completed within a hunt 6 area, the remaining licenses available from that drawing 7 and the licenses available for the random drawing for that 8 9 hunt area will be issued through a random selection from among all applicants in the hunt area who were not selected 10 for issuance of a license for the species through the 11 preference point drawing in that hunt area. For purposes of 12 13 assigning points under this subsection, any unsuccessful 14 license applicant failing to apply for a license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of applying, during the second 15 calendar year shall be considered to be a first year 16 17 applicant for any subsequent calendar year in which the applicant submits license application for that particular 18 19 species.

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21 (h)(j) Rules and regulations shall be promulgated by
22 the game and fish commission to carry out subsections (a)
23 through (f) and (h) of this section and may be promulgated
24 as provided in subsection (g) of this section.

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2 23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 3 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency 4 required.

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Subject to the provisions of this subsection, as 6 part of any preference point program for resident and 7 nonresident antelope, nonresident ram bighorn 8 9 nonresident moose, resident and nonresident deer or resident and nonresident elk, the commission may establish 10 a nonrefundable fee to be either withheld from the license 11 fee remitted or submitted separately when application for a 12 13 license or preference point is made through electronic licensing, and may also establish a fee to be paid in lieu 14 of applying for licenses that are limited in quota. 15 Retention of the established fee or payment of the fee in 16 17 lieu of applying shall authorize the person to accumulate a preference point for future drawings for licenses that are 18 limited in quota for the applicable species in accordance 19 20 with rules of the commission. The rules may provide for 21 the loss of all accumulated points for persons failing to 22 apply or to pay the in lieu fee in two (2) consecutive The fee for any program under this 23 calendar years. subsection for antelope, deer or elk shall be established 24

by rule and shall not exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per 1 species for nonresidents and twenty dollars (\$20.00) per 2 3 species for residents. Payment of the fee shall be made in 4 compliance with application dates. Nothing in this 5 subsection authorizes the commission to establish or retain a fee for resident moose or resident ram bighorn sheep 6 in addition 7 preference points to the established by subsection (k) of this section or 8 9 establish rules for ram bighorn sheep or moose preference 10 point drawings in conflict with the provisions of W.S. 11 23-1-703(b). For nonresident ram bighorn sheep nonresident moose licenses, the commission may establish by 12 13 rule a nonrefundable preference point fee to be withheld either the license fee remitted or 14 submitted separately when application for a license or preference 15 through electronic licensing 16 point is made and 17 establish a fee in lieu of making application in an amount greater than that established under subsection (k) of this 18 section, but neither fee shall exceed one hundred dollars 19 20 (\$100.00). Fees established under this subsection may be 21 set at lower amounts for youth license applicants. Nothing 22 in this subsection shall be construed as prohibiting the commission from issuing a different number of licenses for 23 24 residents and nonresidents.
