5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-17-105(e)(intro), (i)(intro), (ii)
- 8 and (g) and 21-18-202(a)(iii) are amended to read:

- 10 21-17-105. Tuition to be as nearly free as possible;
- 11 number, qualifications and selection of students for
- 12 reduced tuition; tuition for veterans, their spouses and
- 13 children; reciprocal residency.

1	(e) Effective for the $\frac{2014}{2015}$ summer school session
2	and each semester thereafter, any person who is a military
3	veteran who does not qualify as a resident pursuant to
4	subsection (d) of this section an applicant for resident
5	tuition who is a veteran or eligible individual, as
6	described in 38 U.S.C. 3679(c)(2), shall qualify as a
7	resident for purposes of tuition at the University of
8	Wyoming or Wyoming community college if the person
9	<pre>applicant provides:</pre>
10	
11	(i) A certificate or other evidence of honorable
12	discharge from the veteran's qualifying service in the
13	uniformed services of the United States:
14	
15	(ii) Documented evidence at the time of
16	<pre>enrollment that: the veteran has taken steps to establish</pre>
17	residency in Wyoming.

19	(A) The applicant for resident tuition
20	intends to live in Wyoming during the term of enrollment;

1	(B) The veteran was discharged or released
2	from a qualifying period of service in the active military,
3	naval or air service before the date of enrollment;
4	
5	(C) If the applicant is a spouse or child
6	of the veteran, the applicant is a transferee pursuant to
7	38 U.S.C. 3311(b)(9) or 3319 of the veteran's eligibility
8	for educational benefits.

10	(g) <del>Once a military veteran <mark>A person who</mark></del> has
11	qualified for resident tuition under subsection (e) of this
12	section, the veteran shall remain qualified in subsequent
13	years upon complying with paragraph (c) (ii) of this section
14	if the person pursues one or more courses of education
15	while remaining continuously enrolled, other than during
16	regularly scheduled breaks, lives in the state during the
17	term of enrollment and, if the person is eligible through a
18	transfer of eligibility pursuant to 38 U.S.C. 3319, the
19	transfer has not been validly revoked.

21	21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission.

1 (a) The commission shall perform the following 2 general functions: 3 4 (iii) Establish residency requirements, which shall include provisions for military veterans, their 5 6 spouses and children consistent with the requirements of 7 W.S. 21-17-105(e); 8 9 Section 2.
