4 (viii) For capital construction 5 projects:

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In expending funds for (E) capital construction projects appropriated under this paragraph 2012 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 16, Section 1(c)(viii), for capital construction projects funded under the 2013 supplemental appropriation and for capital construction projects funded under prior biennial appropriations which are expended on and after the effective date of this act, the director of department, in consultation with the the governor, shall develop a construction schedule in consideration of parameters established by this subparagraph. These parameters are not intended to be quantifiable. The parameters are to be established for use in efficiently administering available resources and in scheduling capital construction projects in a manner maximizing taxpayer's value in deploying

1	resources. Any decision rendered by the director
2	under this subparagraph is a discretionary
3	determination not subject to judicial review.
4	The construction schedule developed in accordance
5	with this subparagraph shall consider parameters
6	that:
7	
8	(I) <u>Maximizes Maximize</u> cost
9	savings at or below project budget amounts
10	specified under this paragraph appropriated by
11	<pre>law;</pre>
12	
13	(II) Optimizes Optimize
14	Wyoming workforce opportunities at a predictable
15	and manageable level;
16	
17	(III) Provides <u>Provide</u> for
18	construction throughout the state in a manner as
19	uniform as is possible; and
20	
21	(IV) Prevents <u>Prevent</u>
22	unnecessary delays in initiating and implementing
23	building and facility remedies.
