1 33-1-117. Expedited licenses and temporary permits 2 for military service members and military spouses. 3 4 (a) As used in this section: 5 (ii) "Applicant" means a military service member 6 7 or military spouse seeking licensure from a professional or 8 occupational licensing board of this state; 9 (v) "Military service member" means an active 10 11 member of the uniformed services as defined in W.S. 12 8-1-102(a)(xxii) or a person released from military service within two (2) years of applying for licensure, 13 certification or registration pursuant to this section and 14 whose service was characterized upon release as honorable; 15 16 17 (vii) "Military service" means service in the 18 uniformed services as defined in W.S. 8-1-102(a)(xxii). 19 20 (b) A professional or occupational licensing board 21 shall issue an expedited license to a military service member or military spouse to within thirty (30) days of 22 receiving a completed application which would allow the 23

military service member or military spouse to lawfully 1 2 practice a profession or occupation requiring licensure in 3 this state if the military service member or military 4 spouse: 5 (i) Holds a relevant, active occupational or 6 7 professional license in good standing from another state 8 and provides a military identification card, their spouse's military identification card or a marriage license as proof 9 10 of being a military service member or military spouse; 11 (v) Provides a copy of military orders for 12 military service in this state and submits to the authority 13 of the licensing authority in this state for purposes of 14 15 standards of practice, discipline and fulfillment of any 16 continuing education requirements. 17 18 (e) Pursuant to rules which may shall be adopted for 19 this purpose, a professional or occupational licensing 20 board may issue a temporary practice permit to a military service member or military spouse applicant who meets the 21 requirements of paragraph (b)(i) of this section and who 22

The military service member or 2 military spouse applicant may practice under the temporary 3 permit for a period not to exceed three (3) years provided 4 the military service member or military spouse is making 5 satisfying the licensure progress toward unmet requirements, or until the professional or occupational 6 license for which they have applied has been either granted 7 8 or denied, whichever first occurs. A board shall not charge a military service member or military spouse any fees for a 9

7 (h) In determining whether a military service member 8 applicant's education and training meet a professional or 9 occupational licensing board's respective educational and 10 training requirements, the board shall consider any 11 relevant education, training and experience received by the applicant as a member of the armed forces or reserves of 12 the United States, the national guard of any state, the 13 military reserves of any state or the naval militia of any 14

(j) Any emergency medical service license sought under W.S. 33-26-110 through 33-26-113 by a veteran of military service, by a military service member except a member of the national guard, by a national guard member separating from an active duty tour or by the spouse of any of these persons shall be processed and considered pursuant to the requirements of the Recognition of Emergency Medical
