Water development amendments.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to water development; providing that the 2 water development program is for projects necessary for 3 public benefit as specified; requiring commission members 4 to disclose specified information; requiring the state 5 engineer to maintain a list of beneficial uses of water; 6 providing applicability; and providing for an effective 7 date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10

Section 1. W.S. 41-2-112(a), 41-2-113(a) by creating a new paragraph (iv), 41-2-121(c) by creating a new paragraph (iii) and 41-3-101 are amended to read: 14

15 **41-2-112.** Wyoming water development program.

2 The Wyoming water development program is (a) 3 established to foster, promote and encourage the optimal 4 development of the state's human, industrial, mineral, agricultural, water and recreational resources. The program 5 shall provide, through the commission, procedures and 6 for the planning, selection, 7 policies financing, 8 construction, acquisition and operation of projects and facilities for the conservation, storage, distribution and 9 10 use of water, necessary in the public interest to develop 11 and preserve Wyoming's water and related land resources. 12 The program shall: 13 (i) Encourage development of water facilities 14

15 for irrigation, for reduction of flood damage, for 16 abatement of pollution, for preservation and development of 17 fish and wildlife resources and for protection and 18 improvement of public lands; and shall

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20 <u>(ii) H</u>elp make available the waters of this 21 state for all beneficial uses, including but not limited to 22 municipal, domestic, agricultural, industrial, instream 23 flows, hydroelectric power and recreational purposes, as

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defined in statute or determined by the state engineer, the 1 2 conservation of land resources and the protection of the 3 health, safety and general welfare of the people of the 4 state of Wyoming. 5 41-2-113. Definitions. 6 7 8 (a) As used in W.S. 41-1-106 through 41-1-108 and 9 41-2-107 through 41-2-118: 10 (iv) "Public benefit" for the purpose of 11 12 participating in water development commission programs 13 means the use of Wyoming's water in the public interest for beneficial uses as defined in statute or determined by the 14 15 state engineer. 16 17 41-2-121. Criteria for water development projects; disclosure of personal interests by commission. 18 19 20 (c) Within sixty (60) days after the effective date 21 of this subsection or within sixty (60) days following appointment and annually on or before January 1, each 22 member of the commission shall file written disclosures 23

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relative to all interests held by the member or the 2 member's spouse, including interests in partnerships and 3 corporations, with the secretary of state, of: 4 5 (iii) Any interests in a law firm or legal 6 practice that represents clients with applications for water projects or clients who have water projects that are 7 8 funded by the commission. 9 41-3-101. Nature of water rights and beneficial use. 10 11 12 (a) A water right is a right to use the water of the 13 state, when such use has been acquired by the beneficial application of water under the laws of the state relating 14 15 thereto, and in conformity with the rules and regulations 16 dependent thereon. Beneficial use shall be the basis, the 17 measure and limit of the right to use water at all times, 18 not exceeding the statutory limit except as provided by 19 W.S. 41-4-317. In addition to any beneficial use specified 20 by law or rule and regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, 21 the use of water for the purpose of extracting heat therefrom is considered a beneficial use subject to prior 22 23 rights. Water being always the property of the state,

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rights to its use shall attach to the land for irrigation, 1 2 or to such other purposes or object for which acquired in 3 accordance with the beneficial use made for which the right 4 receives public recognition, under the law and the administration provided thereby. Water rights for 5 the direct use of the natural unstored flow of any stream 6 cannot be detached from the lands, place or purpose for 7 which they are acquired, except as provided in W.S. 8 9 41-3-102 and 41-3-103, pertaining to a change to preferred 10 use, and except as provided in W.S. 41-4-514. 11 12 (b) The state engineer shall develop and maintain a 13 list of all beneficial uses as provided in statute or 14 determined by the state engineer. The list of beneficial

15 <u>uses shall be available in print for public inspection at</u> 16 <u>the office of the state engineer and shall be made</u> 17 <u>available on the website of the state engineer. Nothing in</u> 18 <u>this subsection shall be deemed to affect any beneficial</u> 19 <u>use determination made prior to July 1, 2017 for any</u> 20 <u>existing water right.</u>

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Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
