Access and dissemination to, of, 3 information. 4 5 (a) Criminal history record information shall disseminated by criminal justice agencies in this state, 6 7 whether directly or through any intermediary, only to: 8 9 (xlii) The board of chiropractic examiners for 10 purposes of obtaining background information on persons 11 applying for initial licensure under title 33, chapter 10 of the Wyoming statutes, and for purposes of investigation 12 of complaints and disciplinary action against licensees of 13 14 the board. 15 16 7-19-201. State or national criminal history record 17 information. 18 19 The following persons shall be required to submit 20 to fingerprinting in order to obtain state and national criminal history record information: 21

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1 (xxxvi) All persons applying for initial 2 licensure to the board of chiropractic examiners under 3 title 33, chapter 10 of the Wyoming statutes, and any 4 licensee of the board of chiropractic examiners upon written request from the board as part of an ongoing 5 6 investigation of or disciplinary action against the 7 licensee. 8 9 33-10-106. Application for license; educational 10 requirements; fees; criminal history record background 11 check. 12 (a) Any person wishing to practice chiropractic in 13 this state shall make application to the board of 14 chiropractic examiners, upon such form and in such manner 15 16 as may be prescribed and directed by the board. Each 17 applicant shall be a graduate of a recognized school of chiropractic having an accredited program 18 which is 19 professional in content and which meets the academic and 20 training standards established by the board. There shall be 21 paid by each applicant a license fee in an amount established by the board pursuant to W.S. 33-1-201 which 22 fee shall accompany the application. 23
