## A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

1 RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming JOINT constitution to specify that the legislature has the 2 authority to determine the amount of public school funding; 3 requiring the legislature to take into consideration 4 currently available revenues and funding requirements when 5 funding the public schools; further defining the roles of 6 the legislature and judiciary in the creation and review of 7 the state's school finance system; and providing a ballot 8 9 statement.

## 6 Article 7, Section 9 Taxation for schools.

7

8 (a) The legislature shall make such further provision 9 by taxation or otherwise, as the legislature rationally 10 determines necessary together with the income arising from 11 the general school fund will to create and maintain a 12 thorough and efficient system of public schools, adequate 13 to the proper instruction of all youth of the state, between the ages of six and twenty-one years, free of 14 15 charge; and in view of such provision so made, the 16 legislature shall require that every child of sufficient physical and mental ability shall attend a public school 17 18 during the period between six and eighteen years for a time 19 equivalent to three years, unless educated by other means. 20 In determining the amount of funding to provide for the 21 public schools, the legislature shall take into consideration currently available revenues and other 22

1 <u>funding requirements that provide for the health, safety</u>

2 and welfare of citizens of Wyoming.

4 (b) It is the duty of the legislature to equitably 5 allocate funding among the school districts in the state in 6 a manner meeting constitutional requirements. It is the duty of the legislature to rationally determine the level 7 8 of funding to ensure that the system of public schools is 9 adequate, thorough and efficient. It is the province of 10 the judiciary to declare a system of public school funding 11 in violation of the constitution when presented with an 12 appropriate case establishing the failure of the 13 legislature to meet its duties. The legislature alone has 14 the power to generate revenue, through taxation or otherwise, for the operation of the system of public 15 16 schools. The judiciary shall not command the legislature to 17 take any action to generate revenue, through taxation or 18 otherwise in order to fulfill its duties to fully fund the public school system. 19

21 Section 2. That the Secretary of State shall endorse

22 the following statement on the proposed amendment:

1 This amendment would provide that the amount of funding 2 appropriated to create and maintain the public school 3 system must be rationally determined by the legislature to 4 ensure it is adequate, thorough and efficient, while taking 5 currently available revenues into account without additional taxation and funding requirements that provide 6 for the health, safety and welfare of citizens of the 7 8 state. The amendment would also provide that the judiciary could still declare the school funding system in violation 9 of the constitution, though the judiciary could not command 10 11 the legislature to generate revenue to fund the public
